Subj: AUTHORIZED DELEGATED FUNCTIONS FOR DENTAL TECHNICIANS

1. Purpose. To list functions authorized to be delegated to dental assistants assigned to the Naval Dental Center, San Diego in compliance with references (a) and (b).

2. Cancellation. NAVDENCENS DIEGO INST 6620.1.

3. Discussion. The Practice Act gives each State Board of Dentistry authority to establish rules and regulations for delegating functions to dental assistants. Prudent delegation of functions to dental assistants maximizes use of available manpower, improves access to care, and increases the effectiveness of the dental team. Reference (a) lists functions some, or all, states allow dental assistants to perform.

4. Policy. Enclosures (1) through (11) list, by category, the functions authorized by references (a) and (b). Any or all of these functions may be delegated to Naval Dental Center dental assistants. No formal training nor special examination of the individual's competency to perform the function is required. Education by the supervising dentist in a specific function and the good judgment of the supervising dentist are the criteria on



which to judge the competency of the assistant to perform that specific delegated function. The dentist retains ultimate responsibility even though the function is delegated to the dental assistant.


5. All dentists and dental assistants are authorized and encouraged to participate to the maximum level of their competency and drive. This instruction authorizes and encourages the prudent use of delegated functions.

6. Definitions

a. Direct Supervision (*). The dentist must be in the vicinity of the operatory while the assistant is performing the function.

b. Indirect Supervision. The dentist must be in the clinic and available for evaluation while the dental assistant is performing the function.

7. Action. Branch Directors shall ensure that all of their health care providers receive training on this instruction.

AUTHORIZED DELEGATED FUNCTIONS COMMON TO ALL DENTAL DISCIPLINES

1. Seat the patient (including professionalism associated with putting the patient at ease and conveying "WE CARE" attitude, and positioning patient and light).
2. Overall readiness of the operatory.
3. Complete DIRS and MEPRS for all procedures.
4. Complete 603(A) entry for routine procedures as well as for entries requiring S.O.A.P. format.
5. Coordinate and schedule doctor's appointments.
6. Fill out prescription for doctor's signature (e.g., Motrin, Peridex, Tylenol #3, Amoxicillin, Penicillin, Erythromycin, Tetracycline, Diazapine, Lorazopine, Triazolam).
7. Familiarity with Physicians's Desk Reference.
8. Inspect the oral cavity.
9. Apply topical anesthetic agents.
10. Knowledge of passing of instruments.
11. Deliver oral hygiene instructions.
12. Review of patient's health questionnaire (including annotating comments regarding any significant findings for the doctor's review).
13. Expose, process, and mount radiographs.
14. Management of dental emergencies: (JADA, Vol 124, AUG 93).
 - a. Unconsciousness
 - b. Altered consciousness
 - c. Convulsions
 - d. Respiratory distress
 - e. Drug related crises (local anesthetic overdose, allergic skin RXN, systemic allergic RXN)
 - f. Chest pain (MI, Angina)

AUTHORIZED DELEGATED APPOINTMENT DESK FUNCTIONS

1. Phone manners, courtesies, and techniques.
2. Coordination of patient flow through sickcall.
3. Triage of sickcall patients relative to:
 - Immediate need to see a sickcall doctor - or
 - Be appointed for definitive treatment (EXAMPLE: Ask Patient: How long has it been hurting? Would you like to see a doctor today on an emergency basis, for immediate relief of pain or may I schedule you an appointment for a permanent restoration?)
 - If a patient was a Class 3 before being reclassified to Class 4, appoint for definitive treatment not oral diagnosis (T-2 Will be performed at same appointment)
 - If a patient requests prosthetics, schedule an appointment for oral diagnosis not prosthetics
4. Proper screening of records and completion of forms for Dental Officer's signature:
 - SF-88 (Less than 90 percent days for separation)
 - OSS (Including use of worldwide dental services available guide).
5. Management of multiple appointment books.
 - Including proper scheduling of time relative to difficulty of treatment (doctor must convey time needed for next appointment).
 - Annotate appointment book for 24 hour advance check receipt of any lab work required.
 - Consider appointing patients for same day consecutive appointments (e.g., operative followed by cleaning).
 - All patients must be evaluated by the oral surgeon before being scheduled for extraction.
6. Manage patient quick-call list.
7. Verify dental records when issued/returned per NAVMED 6150.1 including:
 - Inserting new 603(A) when current one is filled
 - Ensuring panoramic radiographs are less than:
 - 5 years old for annual exams
 - 1 Year old for Oral Surgery Evaluations

AUTHORIZED DELEGATED APPOINTMENT DESK FUNCTIONS

8. Ensure appointments are confirmed by telephone 24 hours prior to appointment.
9. File/retrieve records.
10. Appointments for dental discipline indicated in treatment plan when record is checked in.
11. Manage Dental Recall Program.

AUTHORIZED DELEGATED ENDODONTIC FUNCTIONS

1. Discuss and explain informed consent (doctor must obtain informed consent).
2. Deliver pre-op medications (w/appropriate HQR):
 - Peridex
 - *Motrin
3. Deliver pre and post-op instructions.
4. Take/record pre-op and post-op blood pressures.
5. Placement of topical anesthetic for routine local infiltration and block anesthesia.
6. Prepare no duty/light duty chit for dental officer's signature.
7. Knowledge of dental materials (composition, properties, indications & proper preparation).
 - CAVIT
 - IRM
 - SEALER
 - NAOCL
 - Ca(OH)2
8. Prepare walking bleach solution and understand correct base placement prior to bleaching.
9. Perform screening diagnostic tests:
 - EPT
 - ICE
 - CO2 SNOW
10. Suture Removal.
11. Single tooth rubber dam isolation (all teeth).
12. Multiple anterior teeth rubber dam isolation W/O clamp.
13. Expose PA radiographs of any tooth in the mouth W/O PID.

AUTHORIZED DELEGATED ENDODONTIC FUNCTIONS

14. Proper handling of radiographic developing solutions, including proper fixing, washing, and drying for archival quality films.
15. Expose and process pre-operative and final radiographs with straight-on and angled views of any tooth in the mouth w/o an aiming device.
16. Expose and process working radiographs with rubber dam in place using hemostats.
17. Dry canals and pulp chambers with proper use of paper points.
18. Place occlusal temporary restorations (includes initial OCC check).
 - IRM/ZOE
 - CAVIT
19. Familiarity with alternative obturation techniques:
 - Lateral condensation
 - Warm vertical
 - Warm sectional
 - Custom fit gutta percha
20. Set working lengths on files.
21. Place and remove all temporary restorations (hand instruments).
22. Knowledge and use of instruments, devices, compounds for:
 - Non-surgical root canal therapy
 - Surgical root canal therapy
23. Know location and correct maintenance for all endodontic devices:
 - Surgical handpiece
 - CO2 Tester
 - Ultrasonic handpieces
 - Touch and Heat
24. *Monitor nitrous oxide analgesia.

AUTHORIZED DELEGATED OPERATIVE FUNCTIONS

1. Recognize caries on bitewing radiographic review.
2. Deliver caries control instructions (Ref: JADA, VOL 124, AUG' 93).
3. Knowledge (composition, properties, indications, material preparation), placement and initial occlusal check of: ("*" ed items require direct supervision for placement/occlusal checks).
 - * - Amalgam (simple only, includes carving)
 - * - Dycal
 - * - Varnish
 - * - Glass Ionomer (Simple only)
 - * - Composite Resin (Simple Only)
(including, etch, glaze, rebond)
 - Cements: GI
 ZNPO4
 PCA

4. Apply topical anesthetic agents (for infiltration and block anesthesia).
5. Expose radiographs.
6. Perform screening diagnostic tests:

7. Preparation of study casts (includes making alginate impressions, polyvinylsiloxane recording of "leafgauge" centric relation, pouring gypsum, trimming casts).
8. *Coronal polishing

AUTHORIZED DELEGATED OPERATIVE FUNCTIONS

9. Apply topical anticariogenic agents.
10. *Apply pit and fissure sealants (includes cotton roll or rubber dam isolation and etch).
11. *Place matrices.
12. *Remove matrices.
13. Place rubber dams (includes retainer selection).
14. Remove rubber dams.
15. Place temporary restorations.
16. Remove temporary restorations (hand instruments).
17. *Apply cavity liners and bases.
18. Place amalgam increments in the prepared cavity for condensation by the dentist.
19. *Place, condense, carve and initial occlusal check of simple amalgam restorations.
20. *Polish amalgam restorations.
21. *Place simple composite resin restorations (includes shade selection).

AUTHORIZED DELEGATED ORAL DIAGNOSIS/SICKCALL FUNCTIONS

24. Fill out prescription for doctor's signature (e.g., Motrin, Peridex, Tylenol #3, Amoxicillin, Penicillin, Erythromycin, Tetracycline, Diazapine, Lorazopine, Triazolam).

25. Recognize radiographic evidence of periodontal disease (e.g., furcation involvement).

26. Demonstrate knowledge of common child behaviors and management styles.

AUTHORIZED DELEGATED ORAL DIAGNOSIS/SICKCALL FUNCTIONS

1. Triage of sickcall patients relative to immediate need to see a sickcall doctor or to be appointed for definitive treatment (for example: asking patient how long it has it hurt? Would you like to see a doctor today, on an emergency basis, for immediate relief of pain or may I schedule you an appointment for a permanent restoration?).
2. Management of multiple appointment books (including proper scheduling of time relative to treatment).
3. Proper handling of radiographs, developing solutions, including proper fixing, washing, and drying for archival quality films.
4. Expose, process and mount BW, full mouth and panoral radiographs.
5. Expose PA radiographs of any tooth in the mouth without PID.
6. Take and record blood pressure and oral temperature.
 - Understand significance of diastolic and systolic readings and their normal range.
 - Know departmental referral policy.
7. Review of patient's health questionnaire (including annotating comments regarding any significant findings for the doctor's review).
8. Proper screening of records and completion of forms for doctor's signature:
 - SF 88 (Less than 90 days for separation).
 - OSS (including use of worldwide dental services available guide).
 - DODMERS/ROTC, Diving Physical exams, Retirement/Separation exams, Flight physicals, and Recruiting Duty exams.
9. Oral screening and charting of 603.
10. Knowledge and use of screening diagnostic tests:
 - EPT
 - ICE
 - CO2 Snow
11. Suture removal.

AUTHORIZED DELEGATED ORAL DIAGNOSIS/SICKCALL FUNCTIONS

12. Osteitis Treatment:
 - Irrigation
 - Placement of dry socket dressing
 - Removal of dry socket dressing
13. Fabrication, initial try in and, after doctor's approval, temporary cementation of provisional crowns and stents (including initial occlusal check).
14. Placing/recementing of temporary restorations (IRM & crowns) including removal of excess cement from cemented restorations and initial occlusal checks.
15. Preparation of study casts (including making alginate impressions, polyvinylsiloxane recording of "LEAFEGAUGE" centric relation, pouring gypsum and trimming casts).
16. Preparation (for doctor's signature) of lab request (DD Form 2322) for fabrication of TMD splints.
17. Prepare no-duty/light-duty chit for doctor's signature.
18. Prepare hepatitis screening laboratory request for doctor's signature.
19. Knowledge of dislocated jaw management.
20. Code cart management
 - Code cart inventory
 - Defibrillator daily check
 - O2 Tank operation and pressure checks
21. Be familiar with:
 - Exam types (1 - 4)
 - Dental classifications (1 - 4)
 - Phase dentistry classifications (1 & 2)
22. Be familiar with:
 - Various anesthetic vasoconstrictor concentrations and their appropriate use.
23. Understand appropriate referrals to Auxiliary, RDH, or Periodontist based on PSR results.

1. Discuss and explain informed consent (doctor must obtain informed consent).
2. Deliver pre-op medications (w/appropriate HQR):

3. Deliver pre- and post-op instructions.
4. Take and record pre-op and post-op blood pressures.
5. Placement of topical anesthetic for routine local infiltration and block anesthesia.
6. Prepare no-duty/light-duty chit for doctor's signature.

8. Complete 603A entry (for doctor's signature) for:
- Forceps extraction
- Surgical extraction
9. Suture removal.
